This assignment consists of a **four (4)-page summary analysis** of two (2) readings significant to American History. **It is your responsibility to print the following readings:**

An Excerpt from John Locke's
Second Treatise On Civil Government (1689) (See Notes on Reverse Side of Sheet)
and
Federalist Number 10 (1787) by James Madison

After reading the documents, you are to write a detailed **two-page (2) analysis** of **EACH** of these documents that covers the following:

- 1) Analyze Locke's idea of "contract" or "compact" theory of government. According to Locke, when is revolution appropriate? Why does he spend so much time on the legislature in regard to his theory of political power? Apply your analysis to an **on-going political issue between the Presidency and Congress**.
- 2) Why, according to Madison, is a large republic "better" or "safer" than a small republic? What relationship does the size of a republic have to the "factions" that will develop within it? **Explain two contemporary political issues that Madison might think indicate that factions may be dangerous? Explain in DETAIL.**
