
Freshman Class Student Council Representatives






Congratulations!

In a light conversation about the weather this week, Sister Mary McDevitt referred to the colors of the morning sky as "Advent colors." Hello Nazareth Families!

- Students can contact their school counselor with any mental health concerns or questions from the presentation
- Students can dial 988 for the Suicide & Crisis Lifeline or call 1-800-273-TALK (8255) if they are experiencing a mental health crisis
- As a reminder, students can use <u>Safe2Say</u> if they have a concern about someone else
- Our students can also access a one-time, free mental health or substance abuse evaluation through our Cora Services provider. This confidential resource can help to determine if further services are recommended and how to access those services. Class of 2024 Authorization to Release Information Form

This <u>FORM</u> needs to be digitally signed by each student and their parent or guardian by February 1, 2023. Signing this form grants the college counseling team permission to send your students' transcript, letters of recommendation, and other pertinent documents to colleges when they start applying next fall.
