A New Year. A year filled with 365 (well, 343 at this point!) new days, and each day a fresh start and a new opportunity to live it better than the day before. The January sky gives us some very clear evidence of the dawn of a new day. The sun is literally a ball of fire in the sky. My pic does not do the scene full justice, but I had to pull over to capture this concrete manifestation of the new day.

Some days, God's presence is like that in our lives...it is very clear, possibly through a similar reminder in nature, a gesture of a friend or loved one, or perhaps even a clear and direct response to our prayer.

But as we know, the sun does not always appear as a burning ball of fire or shine so brightly or so clearly on many days. Even if does not rain, some days are just gray, and at this time of year, even damp and cold. Most days are just so ORDINARY!

Liturgically we have moved out of the season of Christmas into what is called ORDINARY Time. Approximately 238 days of the year comprise Ordinary Time. Seems like a long span of ordinariness, does it not? No decorations or lights; not as much visible and concrete evidence of God's presence. Ordinary Time is a specific season in the Church that focuses on the life of Christ during his three years of public ministry, beginning with His Baptism. The final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe represent the goal to which all of history is directed!

Every day of the 238, whether the sun or the Son is evident, we can claim our heritage as children of the King and live according to that identity.

Class of 2023

If your student has committed to a university or college, then they should reach out to the admissions offices of their other universities and colleges to withdraw their applications.

They may be able to do this through their applicant portal, or they can call or email admissions. If they need assistance with this, then they can contact their college counselor.

Class of 2024

SAT School Day

The SAT School Day is being offered to juniors on March 22nd. Students should complete the sign up <u>form</u> by January 22nd if they wish to participate. If your student signed up and they no longer wish to participate, then they should contact their college counselor by February 1st.

College Seminars

The first set of mandatory college seminars is taking place on January 24th and 26th during Activity Period. If Activity Period is their lunch, then they should bring their lunch to school on their assigned day. If your student is in homeroom 1B or 3B, their seminar is on the 24th. If your student is in homeroom 2B or 4B, their seminar is on the 26th. There are a few students who were assigned to a different day than their homeroom so that they can see their own college counselor present. All students have been emailed their assigned day and classroom location.

College Brag Survey

The College Brag <u>Survey</u> is due by February 19th. The survey is used by your student's college counselor to assist them in writing your student's counselor letter of recommendation for college. The college counselor is the only person viewing this survey. The surveys need to be completed in one-sitting as they cannot be started, saved, and continued. We recommend that students type their answers in a word document and then copy and paste them into the survey so there is no chance of answers being lost due to technical issues.

Teachers for Letters of Recommendation

Students were instructed via email to ask two teachers for letters of recommendation for college by April 10th. Students should fill out the teacher recommendation questionnaire for each teacher that agrees to write them a letter of recommendation and let their college counselor know who agrees so that the teacher can be added to the students' Naviance account.
